The 101 Club provides camping with tent space, swimming pools, horseshoe pits, softball tournaments, billiards and table games, potluck dinners, badminton, fishing, dances, paddle boating, a concession stand, and varied opportunities for fellowship in recovery. Wichita Fellowship Club runs a Bingo game every Sunday afternoon to support the club.
